

# Aligning National Approaches to Digital Preservation (ANADP) II: Barcelona, November 18-20, 2013

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# Background

Basic idea:

Instead of working on digital preservation solutions separately and in different countries, work on them together and internationally.

# Why a new meeting?

- Explicitly focused on international collaboration
- Fundamentally practical
- Action-oriented, not informational or theoretical
- Strong emphasis on things we can do now and tangible outcomes

# ANADP I

- Idea for an international conference first floated in 2008-2009
- Took place in May 2011 at National Library of Estonia in Tallinn
- Why Estonia?
  - National commitment to cultural preservation, including digital preservation
  - Economical and attractive conference venue
  - Easy for European participants to get to
- Attended by over 120 people from 20 countries

# ANADP I: The book

- Edited conference volume published in 2012 by the Educopia Institute
- Won the 2013 Society of American Archivists (SAA) Preservation Publication Award
- Identified **47 specific action items** in six alignment areas: legal, organizational, standards, technical, economic, and education

# ANADP I to ANADP II

- Planning meetings at iPres 2011 in Singapore and IDCC 2013 in Amsterdam (with thanks to Cal Lee at UNC-Chapel Hill for keeping the momentum going)
- List of action items winnowed down to a more-focused, more-manageable number
- Planning for ANADP II: location chosen, planning committee appointed, tracks identified, presenters recruited, program drafted, local arrangements completed

# ANADP II

- To take place at the National Library of Catalonia in Barcelona, Spain, November 18-20, 2013
- “Action assembly” instead of a traditional conference, with the emphasis on action
- “[A] highly participatory event in which stakeholders will engage in facilitated discussions and action sessions to produce a set of concrete outcomes for the extended digital preservation community in three areas: Community Alignment, Resource Alignment, and Capacity Alignment.”

## ANADP II: The program

- Three tracks: Community Alignment (i.e. community building), Resource Alignment (i.e. money and other resources), and Capacity Alignment (i.e. education, training, professional development)
- Speakers include Adam Farquhar (BL), Rachel Frick (DLF), Neil Grindley (JISC), Martin Halbert (UNT), Cliff Lynch (CNI), and Vicky Reich (LOCKSS)
